CRITERIA & ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS SISTER PHYLLIS HUGHES (SPH) ENDOWMENT FOR SPECIAL NEEDS SISTER JUDY MORASCI (SJM) ENDOWMENT FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN GRANTS PROGRAM

- 1. When applying, your project will be considered for SPH, SJM or both endowments by the Priority Projects Committee, based on the elements of your proposed program.
- 2. To be considered for the SPH Endowment, the program must meet one of the following five identified areas of community need:
 - a. Basic needs to the poor
 - b. Programs that assist children and/or the elderly
 - c. Programs that provide access to healthcare
 - d. Preventive health programs
 - e. Chronic disease management programs
- 3. To be considered for the SJM Endowment, the program must address at least one of the three identified community needs:
 - a. Assisting women and children;
 - b. Improving the quality of or providing access to medical/dental services for women and children
 - c. Preventive healthcare programs that focus on underserved women and children
 - d. Note: if a program does not meet the above criteria, with a majority approval from the priority projects committee, it can be considered/awarded.
- 4. Maximum award per agency is \$10,000. The award amount of the SJM endowment may be adjusted by a quorum vote of the Priority Projects committee if deemed appropriate.
- 5. Program must be consistent with the following Mercy Hospital mission statement: Dignity Health and its Sponsoring Congregations are committed to furthering the healing ministry of Jesus. We dedicate our resources to:
 - Delivering compassionate, high-quality, affordable health services
 - Serving and advocating for our sisters and brothers who are poor and disenfranchised
 - Partnering with others in the community to improve the quality of life
- 6. Funding may **NOT** support conferences, seminars, capital projects or media promotional programs (capital refers to construction projects)

Other Requirements for Funding and Information

- No consecutive grants from will be awarded through these grant programs. There must be an interceding year before a funded agency may submit a letter of intent for consideration.
- An agency may submit only one letter of intent per agency. Multiple programs of an agency will not be funded.
- Grant reporting required a 12 month accountability narrative explaining how funds were expended will be required in **July 2026**. More information to follow. If you decline or neglect to complete a narrative, you will be ineligible to receive future grant funding.
